Why a European Action Plan?

- European Logistics revenue
 1000 billion €/year ≈ 14 % of GDP
- Growth in international and intra-Community trade
 55% in value since 1999
- Growth in goods transport50% 2000 2020
- Factor of European competitiveness, prosperity and cohesion
- Cross-border social and environmental impacts





Why a European Action Plan?

- Optimisation potential of freight flows over medium and long distances
- Avoid market fragmentation
- Reduce Europe's reliance on imported fossil fuels
- Deal with freight transport carbon dioxide emissions ~ 30% of transport sector's CO2 emissions
 - » Tendency : Growing







Objectives

- Strengthen the European Logistics industry
- Act as a catalyst for change and cooperation
- Reconcile with environmental constraints and limitations of infrastructure
- Co-modality
 - Complementary and efficient use of modes in an optimal European transport system
 - » Looking at each mode individually and their integration in logistics chains

- Additional interviews / questionnaires
- Bottleneck exercise
- In-depth impact assessment
- Prioritisation
- Alignment with other policy areas

Innovation

- E-freight
 - » ICT Information and Communication Technologies Concept of "Internet for Cargo"
 - Electronic mirror of physical freight movements
 - RFID, Galileo
 - Standardisation of data formats

» ITS – Intelligent Transport Systems

- Financing / Standardisation /Legislation
- Overcoming barriers between modes of transport and between infrastructures and vehicles
- Action plan 2008 will have focus on freight
 - On-board unit, navigation aids, digital maps, digitaler tachograph, electronic fee collection, tracking and tracing, transport of dangerous goods and animals





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Quality and Efficiency

- Bottlenecks
 - » Continuous "Bottlenecks Exercise"
- Jobs in logistics
 - Training
 - Attractiveness
 - Mobility

Quality and Efficiency - continued

- Performance indicators
 - » Core set of generic indicators for measuring and recording performance
- Exchange of best practice
 - » Identify and disseminate successful practices
 - » Networks and clusters
- Data on freight transport logistics
 - » Improve the collection and enhance statistical data

Qualifications and training requirements

The Commission will work with the European social partners and other relevant stakeholders to draw up a list of minimum qualifications and training requirements at different levels of specialisation to be incorporated into a framework that can ensure the mutual recognition of training certificates.





Jobs in logistics - continued

 Dialogue on the attractiveness of transport logistics professions

The Commission to launch a dialogue with the European social partners to find ways to improve the attractiveness of transport logistics professions, and explore opportunities for targeting EU Cohesion Policy interventions towards logistics training.





Jobs in logistics - continued

Mobility

Mutual recognition of training certificates and enhancement of attractiveness of logistics professions can facilitate and encourage mobility





Simplification

- Simplification of administrative compliance
 » Single "window" for administrative procedures
- Single transport document to be used by all operators irrespective of mode
- Liability clause (fall-back) an EU standard
- Weights and dimensions in road haulage and standardisation of containers
 - » Incomplete harmonisation
 - » Bigger / heavier trucks?





Green transport

- Corridors
 Promote the establishment of sustainable and efficient "green" distance freight corridors
 - » Comodal solutions
 - » New technologies in propulsion
 - » Access to terminals
- Urban transport
 - » Exchange of best practice in urban transport
 - » Reinforce freight part of CIVITAS
